

A Foreign person who would like to attend a Jobsplus' course must be in possession of a residence card or residence permit. Persons who are visiting Malta on holiday or for a short stay are not eligible to follow Jobsplus' courses. Where applicable, in addition to the residence card or permit a Foreigner needs to fulfil the course's eligibility criteria.

Depending on the country of origin or status, Foreigners are requested to provide the below documentation:

1. **EEA^[1] / Switzerland and their TCN^[2] "family members"^[3] or "other family members"^[4]** - in the case of an EEA/Swiss national a copy of a residence card or residence permit. In the case of a TCN family member or other family member a copy of the registration certificate issued by Malta's Department of Citizenship and Expatriate Affairs.
2. **Refugees** – a copy of the Refugee Certificate issued by the Refugee Commissioner
3. **Long term residents (LTRs)** - a copy of their passport with their LTR sticker
4. **Asylum seekers and Failed Asylum Seekers** – a copy of the Asylum Seeker Document and/or Police Card
5. **Beneficiaries of Specific Residence Authorisation** – Residence Card under SRA issued by Identity Malta
6. **Persons granted the status of Subsidiary Protection or Temporary Humanitarian Protection** - a copy of the Certificate issued by the Refugee Commissioner
7. **Victims of Trafficking-** Residence Permit that includes reference to S.L. 217/07

The above requested supporting documentation need to be provided by the individual when applying for the course.

[1] EEA nationals are those from Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Czech Republic, Cyprus, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain and Sweden. UK Nationals who would have entered Malta prior to the 1st of January 2021 will benefit from the same rights as EU Nationals. UK Nationals who enter Malta on or after the 1st of January 2021 are to be treated as Third Country Nationals.

[2] TCN – Third Country National – i.e. Citizens from outside the EEA/Switzerland, excluding persons who are Long Term Residents or Asylum Seekers, or enjoy the status of Refugee or Temporary Humanitarian Protection, or Subsidiary Protection.

[3] "family members": a) the spouse, provided it does not include a party to a marriage of convenience; b) the direct descendants who are under the age of 21 or are dependents, and those of the spouse; c) the dependent direct relatives in the ascending line and those of the spouse.

[4] "other family member": a) a person who, irrespective of his nationality, in the country from which he has come, is a dependant or a member of the household of the Union citizen having the primary right of residence, or b) a person who, for serious health reasons, strictly requires personal care by the Union citizen, or c) the partner with whom the Union citizen has a durable relationship unless such relationship is in conflict with the public policy of Malta.
