

Award in Private Security Guard Services (Refresher)

Applying for this course:

To apply for this course, you should be 18 years of age up to 65 years of age and possess a Private Security Guard or Local Warden licence. Course Duration

This course is of 10 hours duration and consists of one Module - (including 0.5-hour assessment)

General pedagogical guidelines and procedures for this course:

The delivery of this course will be mainly held through a series of discussions and hands-on exercises. The trainer will also be holding lessons with the learners which will consists of various presentations and case studies.

General assessment policy and procedures for this course:

The learner will be assessed through an ongoing assessment for learning by way of oral, written or practical exercises that will take place throughout each module, to assess and consolidate the learning being covered.

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Module Assessment: The assessment paper will be divided into 3 sections:

- Section A – True or False questions, which all need to be answered.
- Section B – Multiple choice questions, which all need to be answered.
- Section C – Open ended (short answer) questions, which all need to be answered.

The duration of this assessment is of 30 minutes and the pass mark is that of 45%.
