To apply for this course, you should have completed compulsory schooling up to 65 years of age and are able to communicate in Maltese or English.

Course Duration

This course is of 157 hours duration and consists of five Modules

- Module 1 is of 13 hours duration (including 1-hour assessment)
- Module 2 is of 23 hours duration (including 3-hour assessment)
- Module 3 is of 24 hours duration (including 4-hour assessment)
- Module 4 is of 48 hours duration (including 4-hour assessment)
- Module 5 is of 49 hours duration (including 4-hour assessment)

General pedagogical guidelines and procedures for this course:

The delivery of this Course will be mainly held through a series of discussions, class work exercises and hands-on training. The trainer will be holding lessons during which learners' will be exposed to the theoretical aspect. Sessions will consist of various presentations, including demonstrations.
