

## STQARRIJA GHALL-ISTAMPA 31 ta' Lulju 2025

Spezzjonijiet f'Paceville u San Ĝiljan

Matul il-jiem li għaddew, Jobsplus, flimkien mal-Korp tal-Pulizija, l-Aġenzija Identità, u l-assistenza tal-Aġenzija għas-Servizzi ta' Detenżjoni, wettqu numru ta' spezzjonijiet f'Paceville.

Matulhom ġew spezzjonati diversi bejjiegħa ta' biljetti għall-avvenimenti, klabbs u stabbilimenti oħra f'din iż-żona magħrufa għall-attivitā ta' divertiment.

Fl-ispezzjonijiet tal-25 ta' Lulju 2025, ġew mitkellma 20 cittadin Taljan li allegatament kienu qed jaħdmu għal żewġ operaturi differenti. Investigazzjonijiet preliminari wrew li dawn il-persuni kienu impiegati mal-operaturi mingħajr ma kienu reġistrati kif inhu mandatorju bil-liġi.

Matul spezzjonijiet oħra bejn is-Sibt 26 u l-Ħadd 27 ta' Lulju, instabu 13 il-persuna mhux registrati skont il-liġi, u tlett persuni oħra čittadini ta' pajjiżi terzi (TCNs) li kienu qeqħdin jaħdmu mingħajr il-permessi neċċessarji.

Jobsplus ħadet azzjoni konkreta permezz ta' multi u azzjoni fil-Qorti fil-konfront ta' min kiser il-liġi tax-xogħol. Hija kommessa li tkompli ssaħħhañ il-monitoraġġ b'kollbarazzjoni mal-entitajiet relevanti.

### Inspections in Paceville and St Julian's

Over the past days, Jobsplus, in collaboration with the Police Force, Identità, and with support from the Detention Services Agency, conducted a series of inspections in Paceville.

These inspections targeted individuals selling tickets for events, clubs, and other establishments in the area, which is well known for its nightlife and entertainment activities.

During inspections carried out on 25 July 2025, 20 Italian nationals were questioned. They were allegedly employed by two different operators. Preliminary investigations revealed that these individuals were employed by the operators without the legally required registration.

Further inspections conducted between Saturday 26 and Sunday 27 July uncovered 13 individuals working without the legally required registration, along with three third-country nationals (TCNs) working without the necessary permits.

Jobsplus has taken concrete action by issuing fines and initiating legal proceedings against those found in violation of employment laws. The agency remains committed to strengthening enforcement through continued collaboration with the relevant authorities.
